

Play It Safe *with* **Paul and Patsy PennDOT**



Paul & Patsy's 16-year-old daughter, Penni, just received her junior learner's permit. They are aware Penni must complete 50 hours of behind-the-wheel skills building certified by a licensed driver 21 or older and practice for at least six months before taking the on-the-road skills test to obtain a junior license. However, Penni must also adhere to certain other restrictions.

WHAT ARE THE RESTRICTIONS?

- A junior learner's permit or junior license holder may not drive between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m.
- A junior learner's permit or junior license holder may not carry more passengers in their vehicle than available seat belts.
- A junior license holder who accumulates six or more points on his/her license or has a single high speed conviction (26 mph or more over speed limit) will receive a mandatory 90-day suspension of his/her license.
